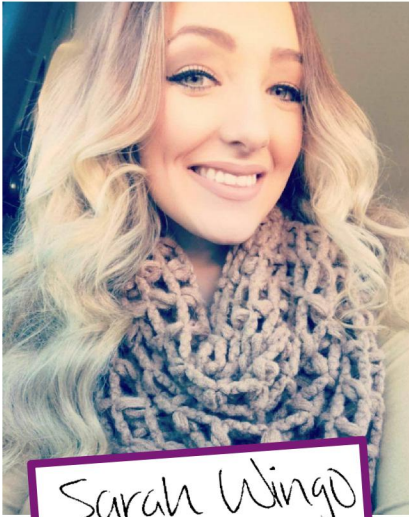




# Riders of the Week
